The Great Light Bulb Change Out is Coming. Are Your Lights Ready?




Did you know that if you replace two incandescent light bulbs with LEDs, you'll lower your electricity use? Now, imagine if every household in Alameda changed out two incandescent light bulbs with LEDs. What would happen then?

We're about to find out. In late January 2015, Alameda Municipal Power, your community-owned electric utility, will mail two complimentary LED light bulbs to every household in the City of Alameda. That's over 60,000 LEDs!

There's got to be a catch, right? Of course there is: We want you to replace your 60 Watt incandescent lights that are frequently on, like kitchen, home office and outdoor, with your new 10 Watt LED lamps. Both types of lights put out the same amount of light (800 lumens), but the LEDs use 80 percent less energy and last over 20 years!


When 60,000 LEDs are turned on, it will be like turning off the greenhouse gas emissions from every Alameda family driving to and from Lake Tahoe every year for the next twenty years!

The funding for this program comes from the short-term sale of some of AMP's renewable energy not needed for compliance with the state's Renewable Portfolio Standard. (The funds from the sale can only be used to reduce GHG emissions.) And it's just one of the projects AMP has planned to reduce Alameda's carbon footprint in 2015. In October, AMP took a busload of our Alameda Green customers on a 75-mile trip north to visit The Geysers, home to AMP's geothermal power plant. The group enjoyed a behind-the-scenes tour with the plant's engineers and saw firsthand how geothermal steam is converted into electrical energy. To cover all of the greenhouse gas generated by the bus trip, AMP purchased carbon offsets through the Garcia River Conservation-based Forest Management Project in Mendocino County.
