





Holiday Lighting Safety Tips

When decorating outside this season, AMP offers the following tips to keep you and your family safe.

- Check your electric lights and decorations before installation for potential hazards. Throw away lights that have frayed wires, damaged sockets or cracked or missing insulation.
- Make sure lights used to decorate the outside of the house are approved for outdoor use. Never use indoor lights outdoors.
- Before stringing outdoor lights, check for overhead power lines. Don't place yourself or any object in a position where you or it may come in contact with a power line.
- When stringing lights on trees, make sure the limbs haven't grown into or near power lines.
 Branches or entire trees can become energized if they contact a power line.

Eliminate Swings in Your Electric Bill with AMP's Balanced Payment Program

If you're using electricity to heat your home or you're on a fixed income, AMP's Balanced Payment Program can help you budget your monthly payments by evening out seasonal billing highs and lows. The plan is available to residential customers who have a current account balance (no past-due amounts outstanding) and who have had service at their current residence for the past six consecutive months.

Monthly payments under the plan are calculated as follows: The total dollar amount of electricity billed over the last 12 months divided by 12 to obtain an average monthly dollar amount (Payments are

estimated for customers without a twelve-month service history.). Balanced pay-

ments are reviewed every six months and the amount may be adjusted at that time. You will be notified if your balanced payment amount is changed.
