Pay your bill securely from AMP's website using My Bill Pay, our online payment system. Available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.



Easy Pay

To save time and avoid late fees, have your monthly payments automatically drafted from your checking or savings account with AMP's Easy Pay.



Pay Through Your Bank

Make monthly payments to AMP using the online bill payment service offered by your own bank or financial institution.



Pay by Phone

Pay your bill over the phone with a check or credit/debit card (Visa or Mastercard only). Our free automated service is available 24/7.

Day by replacing your 60 Watt incandescent light bulbs that are frequently on—like your kitchen, home office or front porch—with your new 10 Watt LED light bulbs? Both types of bulbs put out the same amount of light, but the LEDs use 80 percent less energy and will last over 20 years!

And the sooner you switch to LEDs, the sooner you will reduce your energy use and Alameda's. In fact, if every Alameda home participates, we will reduce electricity by 54,750,000 kWh over the next 10 years, which is equal to 37,750 metric tons of carbon dioxide equivalent!

If you haven't yet, take a moment on Valentine's Day to show Alameda a little love by switching out a pair of lights and then bask in the warm glow of your new LEDs.

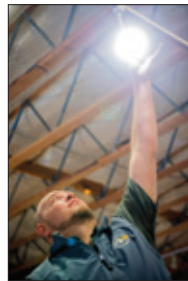
Location: City parking lot on Central Avenue, east corner
