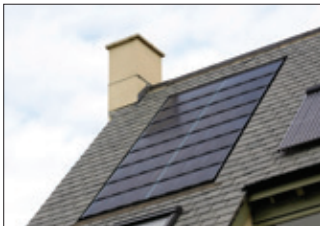

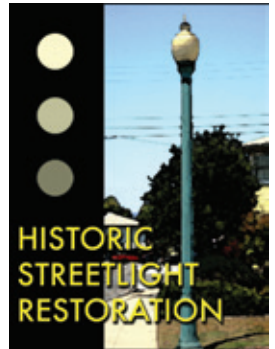

Summertime's Here: Tips for Staying Safe



Here are some simple tips to keep you and your loved ones safe these summer months.

1. Call before you dig

Whether planting new trees, building a deck or installing a mailbox, never assume it's safe to dig. Call 811 at least three days in advance of digging. This enables utilities to mark the location of underground lines and helps protect you from potential injuries, fines and repair costs. The service is free.



2. Look up



Be aware of what's above when you're planning and carrying out a home project. Never use a metal ladder near power lines; never place any ladder where it could slip and touch power lines; and know your surroundings when trimming any trees with an extendable tree pruner or power saw. Never trim trees near power lines. If you see a tree growing too near power lines, call AMP at (510) 748-3900 to report it. And keep yourself and your tools at least 10 feet from any power lines.

3. Play safe

Keep electric cords away from pools and hot tubs. Teach your kids not to fly kites, model airplanes or release metallic balloons around power lines. Never climb a utility pole and never attach anything to a utility pole. Make sure kids aren't plugging in electrical devices, like handheld video games, while wet. And teach them to stay clear of substations and downed power lines. ☑

Streets affected include Buena Vista, Lincoln, Encinal, Broadway, High, Santa Clara, Marina, Windsor, Cambridge, Eagle, 2nd, and Grand. To maintain effective lighting levels, AMP will only work on non-adjacent streetlights. Each streetlight will be restored within seven days.

Nearby residents and businesses will receive written notice approximately 48 hours in advance of when the streetlights in their neighborhood will be refurbished. Streets, sidewalks, front yards and driveways may be impacted during construction.
