NEW PROGRAM FOR LOW-INCOME CUSTOMERS HELPS FIGHT CLIMATE CHANGE





A WIN-WIN PROGRAM

AMP is excited to launch EAP PLUS, a new energysavings program that benefits low-income customers and helps fight climate change.

This win-win program includes installation of energy-saving upgrades at eligible customers' homes, which lowers participants' bills and cuts greenhouse gas emissions.

ENERGY-SAVING UPGRADES FOR EAP PROGRAM PARTICIPANTS

Customers currently enrolled in AMP's Energy Assistance Program (EAP) are now qualified to receive free energy-efficiency upgrades at their homes including whole-house weatherization, efficient LED lighting, advanced power strips and refrigerator replacement.

AMP estimates that the program will save more than

660,000 kilowatt hours of energy, which is the same as avoiding emissions from 99 cars driven for one year.

ENERGY EDUCATION


Educating customers is a key focus of the 18-month program, and can help address affordability by providing lighting and appliance upgrades and energy-saving education, resulting in lower electricity use at home and lower bills.

CUTTING GREENHOUSE GAS EMISSIONS

The program is funded by prior short-term sales of some of AMP's renewable energy credits (RECs). The Public Utilities Board designates these funds solely for projects that reduce greenhouse gas emissions associated with electricity use in Alameda.

CUSTOMER SPOTLIGHT: USS HORNET MUSEUM



The USS Hornet Museum, a local and national treasure, is one of many organizations and businesses benefitting from AMP's Energy Plus program.

LONG-TERM SAVINGS

AMP's program retrofitted the lighting at the Hornet, exchanging old CFL bulbs for energy-saving LED bulbs. The lighting upgrade saves more than 16,000 kilowatt hours of power, and about \$220 per month in energy costs. When you do the math, the Hornet will save more than \$13,000 in five years.

LEARN HOW MUCH ENERGY YOUR APPLIANCES USE

Borrow one of these portable devices from the library or AMP Service Center, and then simply connect it to your individual appliances. The monitor will display consumption by the kilowatt-hour. You can calculate your electrical usage by the day, week, month, even an entire year.
